


C-2 Yokamachi Street (Stone-paved street)

Cutting through the heart of the town, this stone-paved street is lined with wood carving workshops that fill the air with the calming rhythm of wooden mallets. With everything from bus signs to doorplates artfully and expertly chiseled out of wood, here you can feel the unique spirit of the wood carving town Inami.

(B-1) Kanjoji Park

With a commanding view of the sankyoson scattered settlements invoking memories of an older Japan, Kanjoji Park charms with the passing of the seasons. In particular, the light of the setting sun shimmering in the water of the rice paddies in spring can reenergize even the weariest



Inami Wood Carving Composite Hall

The hall houses around 200 wooden works, including ranma transom pieces, lion masks, as well as more contemporary and modern works.

Yoiyasa Festival

Held every year. Pre-festival on May 2nd and main festival on May 3rd.

Beginning in 1833 (the 4th year of the Tenpo era) to pray for good business and household safety, the festival includes 6 portable shrines (3 carried by adults and 3 for children), lions the and festiv from 4 areas of the town. Parading for 10 km, they imbue Inami with a special vibrancy—the lion masks skillfully crafted with Inami wood carving techniques are a must-see!



Wander through old streets in Japan's best wood carving town

Nestled in the foothills of Mt. Yaotome at the southernmost region of the Tonami Plain renowned for its Sankyoson scattered settlements, Inami is a town brimming with rich culture and history. It has flourished as a temple town ever since Zuisenji Temple was founded in this region in 1390 (the 1st year of the Meitoku period) by Saint Shakunyo, the 5th head priest of Honganji Temple.



D-1 Inami Betsuin Zuisenji Temple

Founded by Saint Shakunyo, the 5th head priest of Honganji Temple, Zuisenji Temple boasts the title of the largest Shin Buddhism wooden temple structure in the Hokuriku region. The Sanmon Gate main entrance is particularly splendid and forms the foundation of Inami wood carving.

Hachimanguu Shrine With ruins of the old Inami Castle inner citadel on the grounds and old structures like stone walls still standing, you can imagine the former glory of the fortress. In 1861 (the 1st year of the Bunkyuu era), local silk worth a "silk worm hall" workers established a "silk worm hall" made completely of Japanese zelkova wood on the western side of the main shrine to mourn the souls of silk worms



Ikenami Shotaro Fureai Hall

Shotaro Ikenami, famous author of historical novels such as the Master Assassin Baian series, felt an affection for Inami as the home of his father and often visited. Inside, you can see letters showcasing the heartfelt interactions between Ikenami and the



D-2 Kurokamian

Gently nestled in the grounds of Jorenji Temple are Okinazuka ("old man mound") and Kurokamian ("black hair hermitage"). Zuisenji Temple's 11th priest Rouka, a disciple of the great haiku master Matsuo Basho, took 3 small stones from Basho's grave and built a mound on the Jorenji Temple grounds. After that, it is said that he also offered strands of Basho's hair. With the support of several hundred haiku poets in the Etchu region. Kurokamian was built.




Taishi Den-E and Taishi Den Tourism Festival

C-2 Kyurosui

It is said that as Saint Shakunyo made his way to Kyoto, his horse struck the ground with its foot and the Kyurosui water miraculously gushed forth. Said to be the area of origin of both the name Inami as well as of Zuisenji Temple, and additionally displaying a historical elegance from hermitages and gardens constructed in the Tenpo era, Kyurosui is often sung of in haiku poems together with Kurokamian.



A-3 Shogawa River Gorge
